The net profit increased by Rs. 5693054.91 (13509579.91-7816525.00).
- 3. During the year at No point of time the bank has sanctioned working capital limits more than five crore. All returns are filed with as per sanction letter and as per bank's norms.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND PRACTICES

1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING AND PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:-

All incomes and expenditures having material bearing are accounted on Accrual basis

The accounts as on 31st March, 2024 have been prepared in compliance with the applicable accounting standard referred to in section 133 .read with rule 7 of The Companies account Rule 2014

# 2. PROPERTY PLANT AND EQUIPMENTS:-

Because of change in method of valuation Tax effect on Opening B Stock Rs. 7816525.00 debited to profit and loss account from General Reserve. And closing stock is increased by Rs. 13509579.91. The net profit increased by Rs. 5693054.91 (13509579.91-7816525.00).
